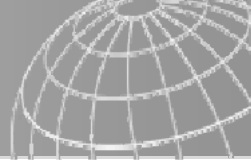

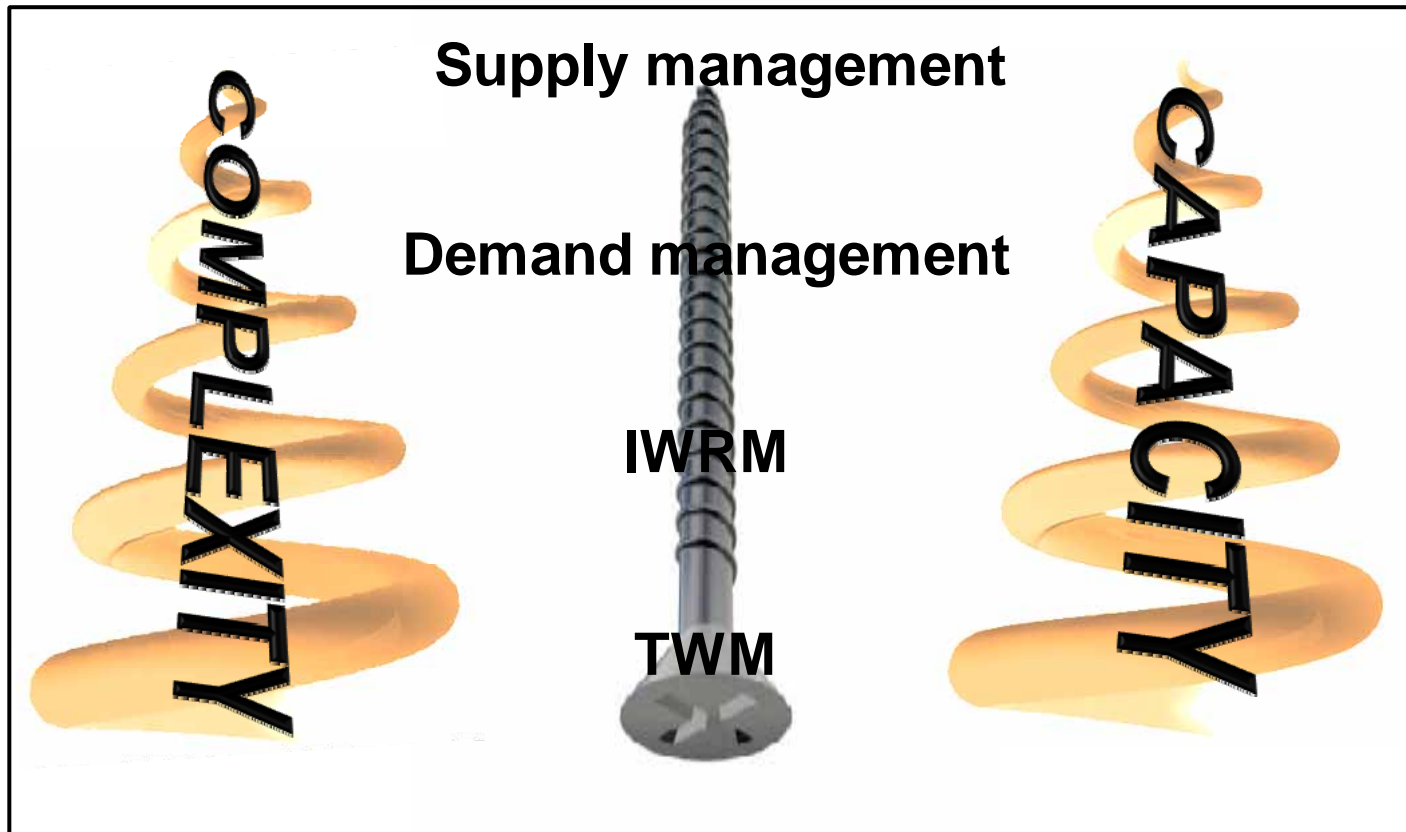
Fig. 1: Planning beyond rivers and borders



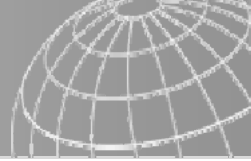


I. Background: transboundary water management

Fig. 2: Turning the water screw



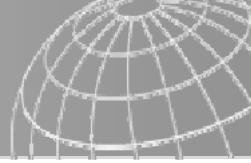

II. GTZ programme: TWM in SADC

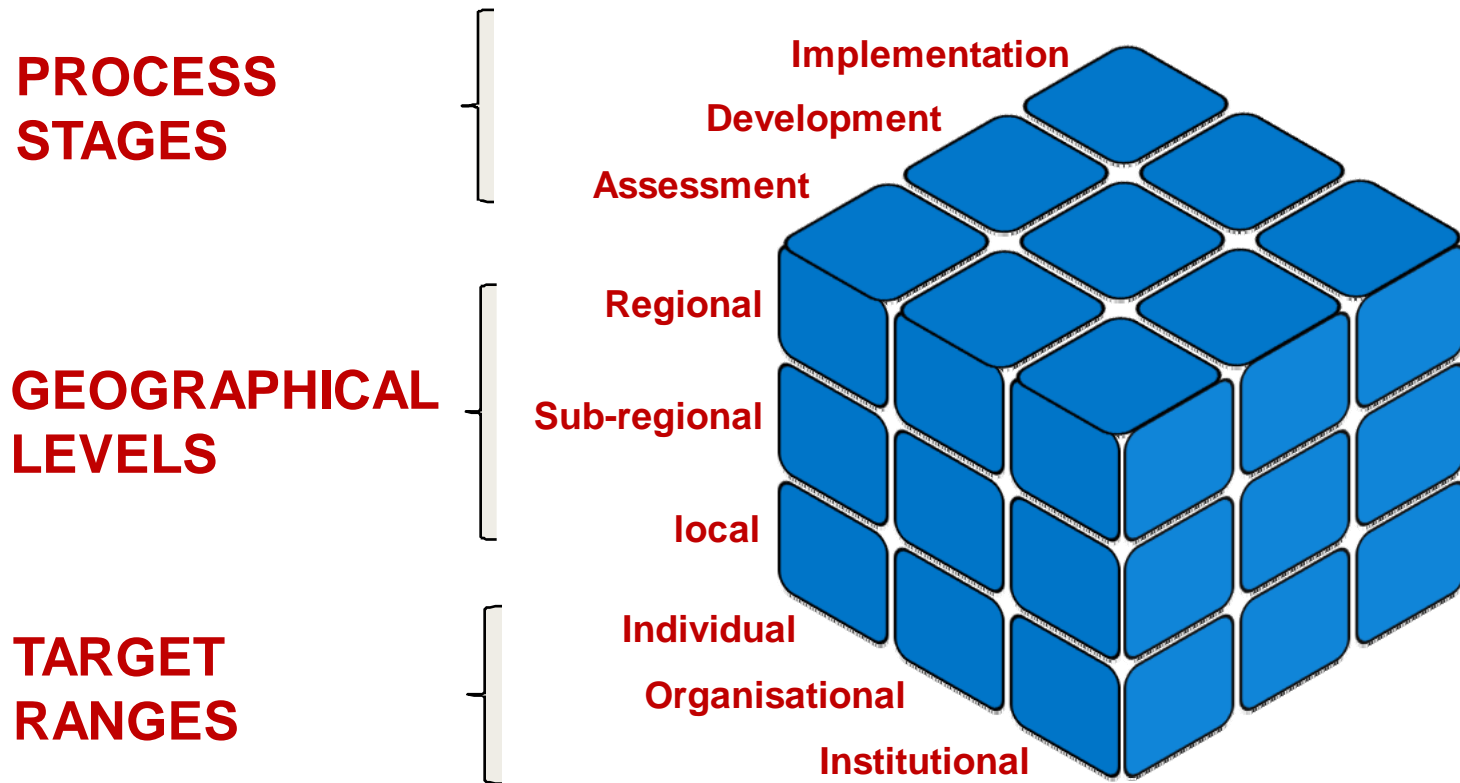
- Overall objective
 - Strengthen human and institutional capacities for sustainable management of water resources in SADC.

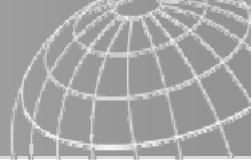
- Multi-dimensional approach

II. GTZ programme: conceptual framework

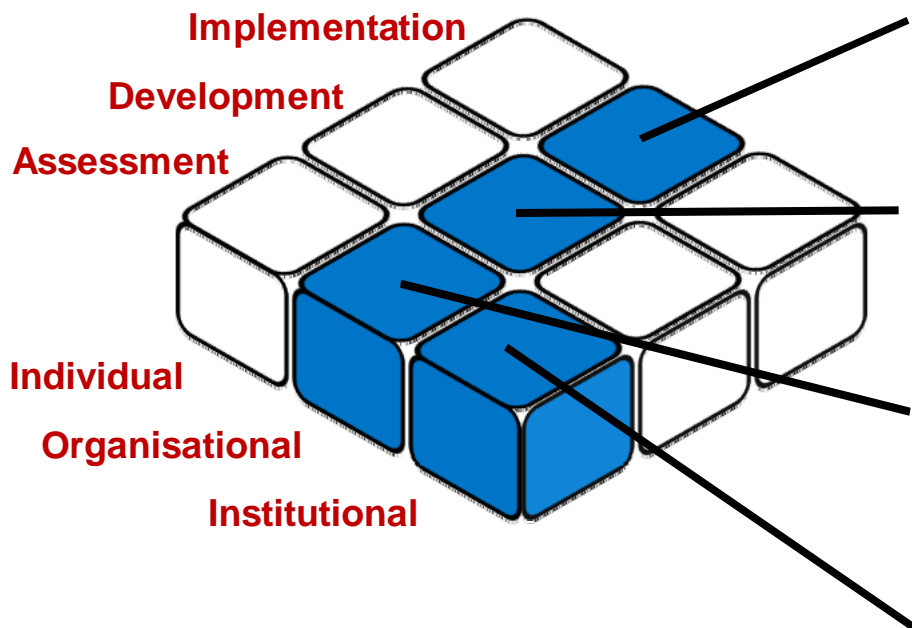
Fig. 3: Transwater Capacity Cube



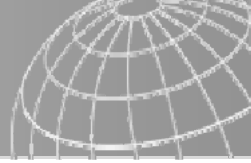

Fig. 4: Regional level (SADC)

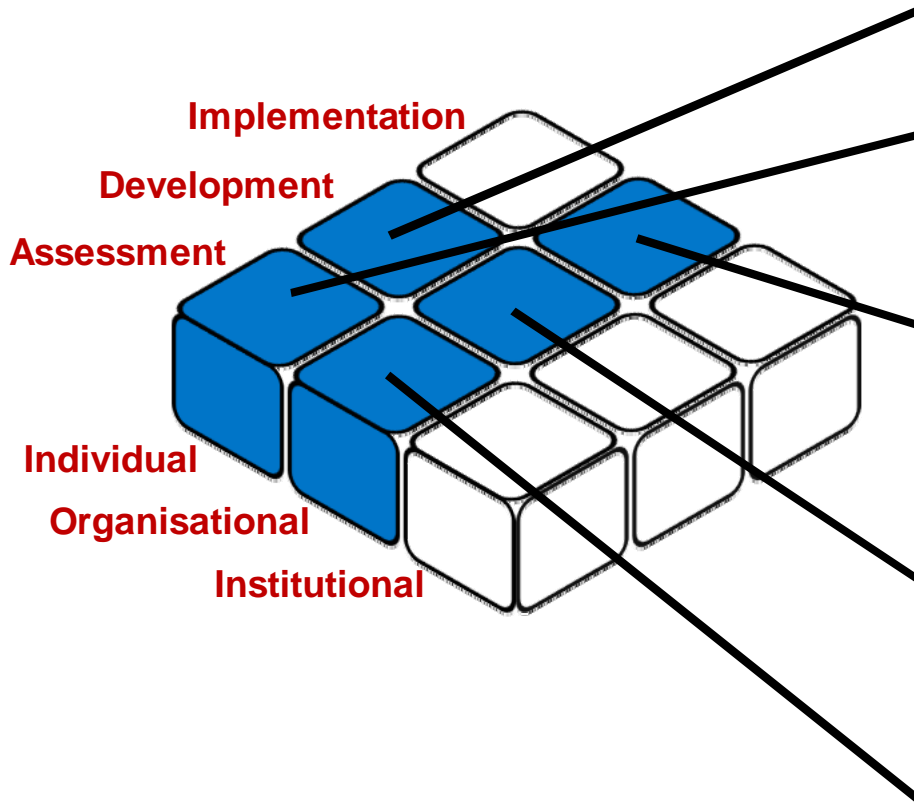

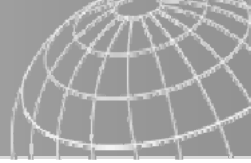

Fig. 5: Sub-regional level (RBO)

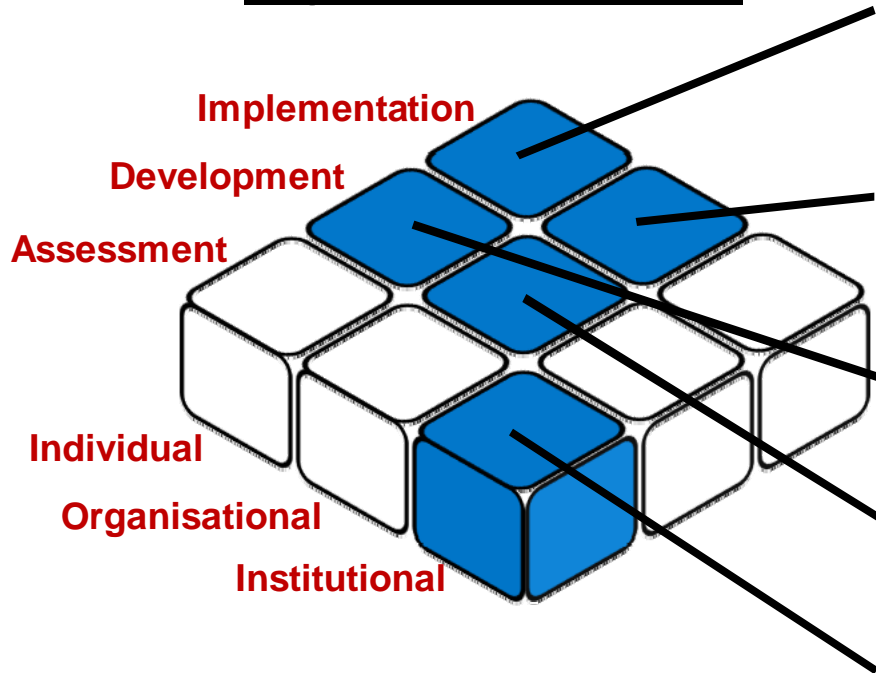

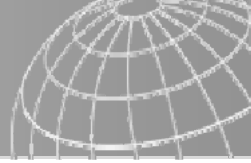

Fig. 6: Local level

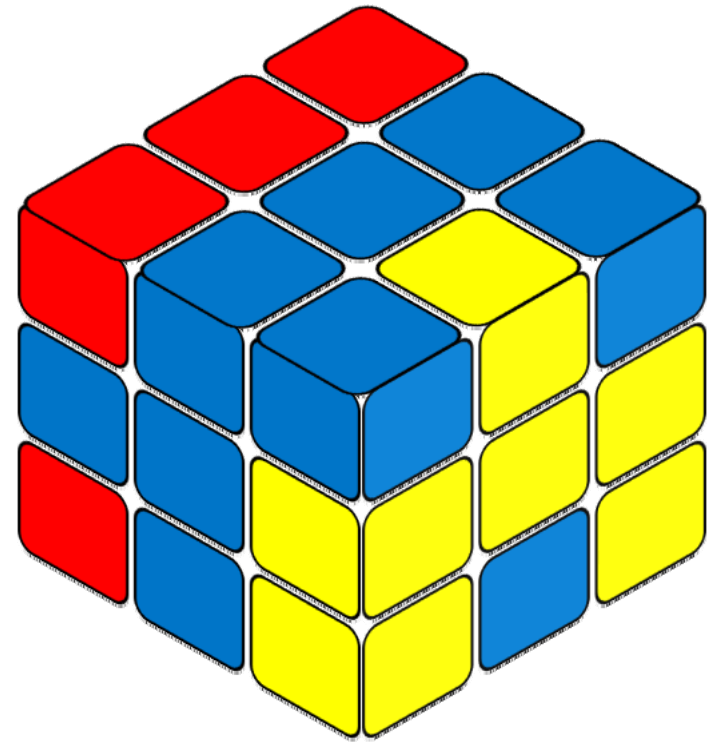
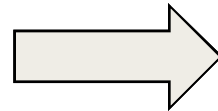
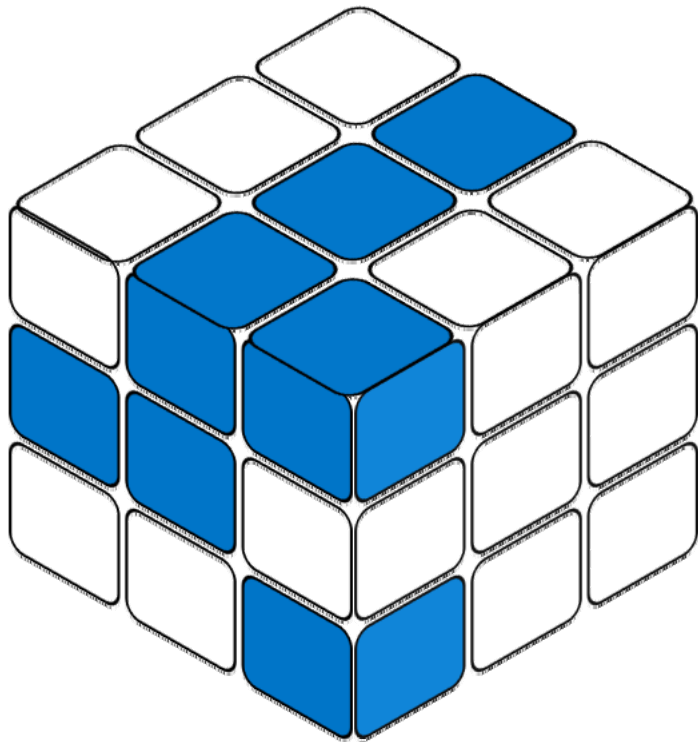
